Hochschule Darmstadt University of Applied Sciences (h\_da) is one of the largest universities of applied sciences in Germany with approx. 17,000 students, 340 professors, and over 60 degree programs.

The University of Applied Sciences in Darmstadt was **founded in 1971**, having roots in engineering, architectural, and design schools.

The university's range of study and research areas encompass engineering, natural sciences, computer science, business, social sciences, architecture, media and design.

As a university of applied sciences there is a strong focus on scientific and applied teaching, research and learning. h\_da has an excellent reputation for its practice-oriented approach to higher education.

Darmstadt, centrally located in the Rhein-Main region, is a medium-sized city (population 160.000) with excellent transportation connections to Europe and beyond. Since 1997 the Darmstadt carries the title "City of Science" due to the number of universities and research centers in the city.



Darmstadtium or Ds – chemical element 110 is named after the city of Darmstadt



# **Short-term Programmes**

By attending one of our short-term programmes in the summer or winter, students will enhance their knowledge and expand their global network.

#### **International Summer University**



Our summer school takes place for four weeks in July and August and focuses on energy efficient buildings, smart homes and renewable energies. The academic module consists not only of lectures, but also interdisciplinary projects and company visits. In addition to attending the academic module and a German language class, we offer an exciting social programme (e.g. canoeing, hiking, BBQ, climbing park, excursions to the Rhine River Valley, Heidelberg, etc).

### Winter University Programme



Start out the new year with new international friends! After celebrating New Year's in one of the largest cities in Germany, the Winter University Programme continues in Darmstadt for three weeks and offers courses in business and social science. The programme is complemented by a German language course and many social activities, such as ice skating, a German cooking night and excursions to nearby cities.

We support guests with the organisation of any non-academic matters for visits to our campus, such as visa support, insurance, housing, and transportation.

As a family friendly university, we will also do our best to welcome accompanying family members and to make sure everyone feels at home.

## for Exchange Students

Accommodation in student residences is available via the h\_da International Office or the Studierendenwerk Darmstadt on a first come first served basis. Rental costs may vary from 350 Euro to 580 Euro per month.

Other accommodation options are shared flats (WG) or small apartments. However, finding accommodation on the private market can be time-consuming. For the summer term, start your flat search in January/February and for the winter term in May/June/July. Although we cannot arrange accommodation on the private market for students, we can provide them with links to the online forums most used by our local students.





## for guest lecturers/visiting staff

The Welcome Center can help international visitors find and book accommodation for short and long-term stays. For short stays, the Welcome Center can reserve a hotel room or provide hotel recommendations. For visits over a week and up to a year, our guests can reserve one of our nine studio or one-bedroom apartments at our International Guesthouse. Prices depend on the length of your stay.

### Life in Darmstadt

Darmstadt is a lively and loveable city that combines an appreciation of the arts with a passion for science and innovation. As a former residence of the Grand Duke of Hessen, Darmstadt offers an abundance of festivals, performances, and museums, which makes it impossible to be bored. After a long day people enjoy relaxing in one of the many parks or enjoy a traditional German 'Feierabend' with friends in the young and vibrant Martinsviertel. The city attracts people from all over the world with its three universities, several international companies, and research institutions e.g. European Space Agency, Fraunhofer Institutes, Helmholtzzentrum for Heavy Ion Research.
